Jamboree Heights State School will be offering the Life Education program, starting **Friday 5th June through to the Thursday 25th June**, for Years Prep – 6. All programs are delivered by trained Life Education Educators. Our school will be offering the following online safety year-level specific programs which are linked to the Australian Curriculum. Learners in 3/4L and 3/4W will attend the session with their respected year levels.

<p style="text-align: center;">Prep: Safety Rules</p> <p>In this module students investigate how to protect themselves in unsafe environments and seek help. They also learn about the people and services that keep us safe and how to identify and respond in emergency situations.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recognising safe and unsafe environments • Safe and unsafe behaviours online and offline <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How to care for others • Places and people we can go to for help 	<p style="text-align: center;">Years 1 & 2: Harold's Online World</p> <p>In our brand-new 2025 program, Healthy Harold helps students recognise the importance of being safe both online and offline. They will also learn to identify trusted adults who can support them.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recognise the importance of being safe online and offline • Identifies safe and unsafe situations online and trusted adults who can help • Identifies that different technologies are used for different purposes and enhance our lives
<p style="text-align: center;">Years 3 & 4: bCyberwise</p> <p>In this updated module students investigate their use of tech and the positives and negatives of being online, including unwanted contact and unsafe situations. The 'Recognise, React, Report' strategy enables them to recognise the clues the body gives when they may be unsafe, to react in appropriate ways and to report and seek help.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Keeping personal information safe online • How to recognise, react and report unwanted contact and potential predatory behaviours <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Responsible and respectful behaviour when using communication technology • Skills for building positive relationships with friends <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Exploring the role of bystanders 	<p style="text-align: center;">Years 5 & 6: Relate Respect Connect</p> <p>In this module, students investigate the importance of respectful relationships, including face to face and online connections. They explore how the physical and personal changes at this stage of life will impact their behaviour, emotions and relationships. They also learn to recognise, react and report disrespectful, unsafe and predatory behaviour online.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Understanding how to respect ourselves & others • Identifying characteristics of positive relationships • Strategies to help maintain positive online and offline relationships • How to recognise, react and report unwanted contact, bullying or predatory behaviours
